

JOIN THE JUBILEE SOUP KITCHEN TEAM


Saturday, January 5, 10:00 a.m.

NEW YEAR, NEW FOCUS...

AN OVERNIGHT WHAT? By Rev. Rebecca White Newgren

Three people died in the cold last winter, which is three too many, as we can all agree. (One had a home so maybe we couldn't have done anything about that.) There are a handful of folks each night in Rockford that don't fit into the mission and try to bear the winter elements in a tent or other temporary structure. Where to do people go when weather gets really cold? The justice center is even closed at night now. If you suffer mental illness, are a registered sex offender, are transgendered, physically weak or follow a religion other than Christianity, nowhere.

We have a warm gym (with showers!) that sits all night. Maybe the answer is an overnight café: one with tables and chairs, coffee and soup, bright safe lights and loving nonjudgmental staff and volunteers. It wouldn't be the cushiest place to spend a night, but it would keep people from dying in the cold. And perhaps we could connect people to the social services they need.

There are more questions than answers at this point, but we are working with the city to find funding, staffing and other partners to put together a warm hospitable place that is safe for all people. We are still working to find answers, but if you have questions, please reach out to the Discernment and Visioning Team. And please pray for the people on the streets this winter and pray God directs the church in making these important decisions.



ALTERNATIVE WORSHIP SERVICE COMING SOON By Rev. Rebecca White Newgren

Our Sunday morning worship is great. We have an excellent choir, talented organist and wonderful lay worship leaders. We relish old favorite hymns and try out new faithful songs. We get creative with our prayers and allow our children to have a voice. Within a traditional framework, we offer our praise to God with energy, intelligence, imagination and love.

We have an opportunity to do something new, to attract a group of people who are not drawn to worship in a traditional setting. We have an opportunity to bring people across racial and socio-economic boundaries to worship together. We have an opportunity to reach out to the members of our church who grew up here, but do not attend.

So, thanks to the support of the Governing Council, once a month we will worship on Sunday afternoon, in the newly re-arranged chapel (many thanks to Scott Hill) with a completely different form and feel. Joshua Patterson, a local realtor and executive director of Wabongo Leadership Council, is putting together a worship band and choir. There will be storytelling and mission making. There will be communion wandering and prayer stations. There will be jeans and coffee drinking. Everything revolves around the Table, now in the center of the room. There is no "up front." All people participate in making worship.

If this sounds odd to you, it means you are more suited for beautiful traditional consistent worship. And I still love you! A new worship service gives us another opportunity to energize downtown Rockford and beyond with God's grace.
