


JOIN US FOR Christmas Eve! Sunday, December 24, 4:30 pm In the Sanctuary and Facebook Live

# Notes from the Music Director

From Britannica: "Advent, (from the Latin *adventus*, 'coming'), in the Christian church calendar, the period of preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas...." During the four Sundays leading up to Christmas, we prepare for it; we deck the halls, light candles each Sunday at church, sing Advent hymns, and whatever your family includes in preparations. I think American culture celebrates gratification more than preparation, and so waiting to sing Christmas hymns seems onerous, perhaps, but Jesus was nothing if not counter to the culture of his time, trying to hold people in power to account, and get them to follow the rules in their own religious texts. So we resist the temptation to sing carols every week in December, and Christmas Eve will be a wonderful time of sing-ing as many as we can squeeze in before people need to run back to food and present prep for the next day.
